
Other functions we will work on are the Pickleball (alternative venue) and Croquet. Watch this space. I am delighted to inform

OUR GUEST SPEAKER- MAL MCKINLAY



Today's guest speaker was Mal McKinlay from Bonny Hills Nursery & Garden Supplies.

Many of our members are well known to Mal having helped with the design and planting of their gardens,

Mal's topic was "Perennial Plants", and how to plant, fertilize and generally keep them healthy.

Mal brought a wide variety of plants and described how each plant would grow and where to place them in the garden. He explained that when we buy perennials it is important to get the best out of them by not putting them in the ground from the pot in one bunch, but to break them up and plant them individually as this would not only be better value, but they would multiply every year. They could then be separated again over many years and planted in other areas of your garden or in pots.

Another important hint was fertilized with a good all-purpose fertilizer such as Dynamic Lifter. Although the normal one has a smell, Stuart mentioned that one was also available with a reduced smell. Potting mix was also important. Use only a good quality mix when planting as the better mixes have more nutrients which will help the plant settle in better.

There were plenty of good questions from the floor, and Mal commented later on the vibe he got from our group. Another interesting speaker.

ONE THING ABOUT ME- PHILIP GARDINER

I have been very involved with Marine Rescue since early 2017. Marine Rescue NSW is a State Emergency Service responsible to the Marine Area Command of the NSW Police Force. Our mission is to save lives on the water.

Marine Rescue NSW operates 44 bases along the NSW coast and in the Alpine Lakes and the Murray River with a small paid staff and over 3000 volunteers. There are normally three tiers of service in each base:

Boat Crews manning the rescue vessels.

Radio Bases, the ears and eyes of the service, which operate 24 hours a day, 365 days per year.

Fundraising Teams for each base.

In Port Macquarie our rescue vessels are: One large Flybridge Cruiser PM30, One Rib PM21 and two Jet Skis, PM11 and PM12.

In the Radio Base we monitor VHF radios, particularly VHF 16 (the International Distress and Calling Channel) on a 24/7, 365 days basis. We look after all boat traffic in the Port Macquarie area and on Lord Howe Island and at night we look after all the bases from Forster to the Queensland border, 16 bases in all.

We log vessels on, with vessel registration, number of people on board, destination and estimated time of return and we check on all vessels to ensure they are safe and return on time. We will call out our rescue vessels to assist any vessel in trouble whether it be a mechanical problem (NRMA jobs), a vessel overdue or in a serious life threating situation such as a MAY DAY call. We are also requested to assist with searches for missing fishermen or swimmers from time to time by the NSW Police.

Two rescues of note:

2017: Sailor called on radio "On fire, getting into the tender, will call on the phone". He was near Hat Head so the phone call was diverted to Trial Bay Base but they could not assist so Port Macquarie sent out a rescue vessel which was met by a trawler who had heard the call and picked up the sailor. Our rescue vessel then went to the site of the burning vessel and attempted to put out the fire but it burnt to the waterline and sank.

2019: Vessel hit rocks at Crescent Head after midnight and frantic calls to the Port Macquarie Radio base set off a rescue mission. When our rescue vessel arrived on the scene they found 3 badly injured fishermen; one had a broken jaw, one had a punctured lung and one below deck with a broken back. Our rescue team had to float the sailor with the broken back out of the sinking vessel on a spine board. All three men were saved but unfortunately the young man with the broken back is now a paraplegic.

For this rescue Marine Rescue Port Macquarie were honoured with an International Maritime Rescue Federation Award in London for the most significant international rescue at sea in 2019.
