Branch Meeting – Thurs 13 March – Speaker will be lan Stann who will give an informative talk, the first part of which is titled "If Switzerland Ran Australia" about the political system in Switzerland which is called Direct Democracy. It highlights how the Swiss have ALL the parties in Government at the same time and participating in running the country. They have no OPPOSITION as all parties are involved in running the Government.
